

CONSTRUCTION CARPENTER

Position Title: Construction Carpenter – non exempt
Department: Field
Reports to: Foreman and / or Superintendent at the job site.

POSITION SUMMARY:

The construction carpenter assists Warfel employees in performing their assigned duties.

The position usually requires the ability to work without close supervision. The description identifies the basic responsibilities, the craft skills and the physical abilities.

The description shall not, however, be construed as a complete listing of all miscellaneous, incidental or similar duties, which may be required from time-to-time.

EDUCATION EXPERIENCE:

- >High School graduate and or equivalent, technical school or college experience
- >Carpentry skills, knowledge, math skills, measuring, blue print reading,
- >Completion of an Apprenticeship Program in the carpenter trade.
- >Knowledge of; machinery, power tools, and power equipment
- >Communication, organizational and people skills
- >Leadership and management of other employees



BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- >Report directly to your Job site Foreman and or Superintendent.
- >Attendance and Punctuality is critical, report to the job site as directed.
- >Able to perform and understand instructions and the ability to work with limited supervision.
- >Provide transportation to and from the job site. A valid driver's license is necessary.
- >Follow all Warfel Company Safety rules and regulations, site-specific safety program.
- >Supply your basic tools that are required for the position.
- >Working together, with other Company employees and other trades, TEAM WORK!

CRAFT SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- >Ability to use and read a tape measure with precise standards and accuracy.
- >Understanding of prints, sketches, building plans with minimum instruction for performing layout, framing, and assembly.
- >Fit and install prefabricated window frames, doors, door frames, weather stripping, interior and exterior trim, and finish hardware, install, align, imbed miscellaneous metal and specialty items, such as handrails, bearing plates, lintels, fire extinguishers, bathroom accessories, and various other tasks.
- >Erect scaffolding and ladders for work on structures above ground level.
- >Smooth and finish surfaces of poured concrete floors, walls, sidewalks, or curbs, to specified textures, using appropriate hand and power tools, as well as positioning and securing steel bars in concrete forms for reinforcement.
- >Perform variety of tasks involving dexterous use of hands and tools, such as demolishing buildings, sawing lumber, dismantling forms, removing projections from concrete, and cut and attach insulating material.
- >Assist other carpenters/employees in the performance of their duties.

PHYSICAL SKILLS:

- Standing:** approximately, 95 % of your time
- Sitting:** approximately, 5 % of your time
- Walking:** often as you change positions and or locations
- Lifting:** weight maximum, 50 pounds, usually lifting 10 – 50 pounds
Frequency varies, equipment available for assistance
- Pushing:** weight maximum, 50 pounds, usually lifting 10 – 50 pounds
Frequency varies, equipment available for assistance
- Pulling:** weight maximum, 50 pounds, usually lifting 10 – 50 pounds
Frequency varies, equipment available for assistance
- Climbing:** varies, some may occur, steps, ladders, and scaffolds
- Bending:** varies, depending on the task and job requirements
- Heights:** working at heights will vary, as well as working with various pieces of equipment that will provide protection at such heights; scaffolds, aerial man lifts, and personal fall protection.

ACTIVITIES:

- > Operate hand and power tools
- > Operates company equipment, and vehicles
- > Stands or walks for long periods of time
- > Use arms and hands to reach for, handle and manipulate objects
- > Lift and carry materials weighing no more than 50 pounds.
- > Climb up and down ladders, scaffolds, and other objects in multi-story buildings and carry tools and equipment.
- > Bend, kneel, crouch, and crawl as appropriate
- > Good use of hand eye, visual and audio capacities

WORK SCHEDULE:

Usually from 7 AM through 3:30 PM / ½ hour lunch
Travel time to the job site varies
Monday through Friday, occasionally Saturdays
Overtime may be required
